To continue to improve performance of PP children in reading, writing and maths, closing the gap between their attainment and that of other pupils in school and nationally	Each teacher tracked progress of PP pupils. Interventions were monitored and reviewed for impact. Pupil Progress meetings (IPPI) happened termly.	KS1 Results show that the gap is closing between PP and non-PP pupils.	To make marginal gains, SLT support worked continuously with maths, writing and reading groups incorporating PP pupils. This was effective from the start of the year and will be continued into next academic year. The positive effect of some whole school strategies used from the Foundation Stage are also seen to be contributing to the rise in attainment for ALL pupils eg Talk for Writing, RWI and Maths Mastery.	£30,960

To make sure that all PP pupils with SEND are supported effectively	SENDCo and TAs delivered targeted support work.	This is still not evident. PP SEND pupils are not making similar progress to their peers.	PP SEND pupils need to receive more Quality First Teaching as targeted group work by TAs is not working as effectively as first thought. Pivotal has been a success especially in Year 5 where there is a large cohort of PP pupils. ELSA specialist regularly works with PP pupils. Just over 50% of her weekly sessions were with PP children.  The HSLW team closed a third of PP TAFs this year.	This is an area which is ongoing. Provision for PP pupils and their families will continue to be managed by very effective pastoral team (DHT/HSLW/Attendance officer/SENDCo/ELSA) with introduction in September of a PP champion to work closely with this team.	£9,800

To continue to improve and increase expectations of all PP and non-PP pupils by all staff	All staff to continue to develop open questioning and higher order thinking skills to enhance quality first teaching and raise expectations.	There is evidence of good practice where teachers have high expectations and engagement of PP and non-PP children. However, this is not consistent across school.	This needs to be a priority for this year particularly for those PP children with low prior attainment. Staff will be following the school vision of “teaching to the top” for ALL pupils.	
To continue to improve the attendance of PP pupils	Designated Attendance officer allocated to work closely with DHT to ensure consistency across school. Attendance data monitored every 2/3 weeks and letters sent out accordingly. Phone calls/meetings/parent contracts arranged if attendance not improved.	As of 10 <sup>th</sup> July, PP attendance was 96.64% which is significantly better than it was at the start of the year (93.32%). Attendance rates nationally for children eligible for FSM in 2016/17 was 92.7%. All our year groups are achieving above this figure.	This is an area which will be ongoing with continuing regular meetings between the DHT and attendance officer, with greater need for parenting contracts.	£6,355

Continue to improve levels of PP parental engagement and confidence in supporting their pupil's learning	Ongoing interaction from DHT either through phone calls, meet and greet on playground or bespoke meetings for targeted pupils. HSLW support where necessary. Coffee mornings for vulnerable families in nursery.	Between 78% and 100% of individual year group PP parents engaged with DHT and HSLW. Successful nursery coffee mornings have reached out to more vulnerable families and built relationships.	This is an area which has grown significantly and the Pastoral provision will be looked at in the new academic year ie potential of developing a Pastoral support unit.	
Continue to increase attendance of PP pupils from 20% to 40% at After School Clubs and other extra-curricular activities	After and out of school provision	Numbers of PP Pupils participating in Clubs reduced slightly this year more likely to the fact less clubs were available than previous years.	DHT needs to continue to liaise with parents/EVC and PE co-ordinators/PP champion to make sure that PP pupils are given ample opportunity to participate in a variety of in school and after school sporting events.	£2000
Continue to enable disadvantaged pupils to have equal access to visits and experiences provided in school	To subsidise cost of visits and visitors to school for PP pupils where appropriate	There 7 PP children who went on the residential, partially funded by school. The remainder went on helping fund other PP children on different school trips and other school activities.	DHT needs to continue to make sure that all PP pupils have access to all visits and experiences especially with the Y6 residential. DHT needs to liaise with PP champion, office manager and HSLW.	£2000
